Have your say on funding for local police and fire services

Northamptonshire Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner, Danielle Stone, is seeking views on the council tax precept – the part of your bill that funds local police and fire services. These services rely on a mix of government grants and the precept, which accounts for around 18% of a council tax bill.

A consultation is now open to ask how much residents are willing to pay in 2026/27. Current proposals suggest an increase of £14 a year for policing and £5 a year for fire for a Band D property. The Commissioner says these changes are needed to balance budgets and invest in vital services.
